**The Lydian Singers** are a chamber choir of some 24 voices based in Knutsford. The choir started in 1980 as a result of an ad hoc carol concert arranged by Michael at Loreto Convent in Altrincham. He was one of the founding members of the choir; the other three are singing here tonight.

The choir sings concerts around the North West of England. They also visit UK Cathedrals to sing weekend services when the resident choir is on holiday and have now visited most of the cathedrals in England. Their most recent visit was to Tewkesbury Abbey in September 2021.

Chester St Cecilia Singers are a chamber choir of 25-30 voices based in the Cathedral city of Chester. The choir started in 1969. Their repertoire covers 500 years of sacred music and some secular and lighter pieces for their concert programmes.

They sing concerts mainly in and around Cheshire. They also visit UK Cathedrals to sing weekend services when the resident choir is on holiday. Their most recent visit was to Tewkesbury Abbey in November 2021

The two choirs have had a 'cousin' relationship for many years. They have shared singers on occasions, travelled together on overseas tours and performed joint concerts. Whilst Michael claimed that he was first and foremost a Lydian Singer, he equally valued his membership of the St Cs.

Michael sang all the Christmas music included in tonight's concert with one or other of the choirs. We are proud and glad to sing it tonight in his memory. We all miss him so much.
