Our Mothering God

As a child, I would run to my mother with every skinned knee and broken heart. Her acceptance was total, and her presence never failed to soothe me. Now I'm grown, and an ocean separates my home from hers. Still, in moments of sadness and struggle, I

long to feel like a child in my mother's arms: completely loved and totally accepted. I rediscover this in the Lord's embrace.

God creates, nurtures and loves us like a mother loves her child. Scripture tells us that God's love surpasses a mother's love, because even if a mother could forget the child at her breast, God could never forget us (Is 49:15). I am so grateful for that truth in the moments when I feel lost and alone. God has not forgotten me. God will not abandon me. Even if I fail all the tests of a perfect Christian, the mothering God accepts me as I am.

As I rest in the divine lap, I let the maternal images of God in the Bible minister to me. They speak to me on a visceral, tangible level of the love of God and provide relatable glimpses into the mystery of divine love. One of my favourite psalms says, "I have calmed and quieted my soul like a weaned child with its mother, like a weaned child is my soul" (Ps 131:2). I come to God my mother for comfort, not greedily grasping for what God can give me, but for the simple joy of being near my Lord.

Perhaps this is what God meant when he revealed himself to Abram as *El-Shaddai* (Gn 17:1). The word *shad* means "breast" in Hebrew. Women nourish, satisfy and pour themselves out as they breastfeed their children. This name may hold a promise that God will care for God's children in the same sacrificial, life-giving way.

One day during a rainstorm, I saw a mother hen spread her wings wide to protect her babies. Jesus loved this maternal image of God as a mother hen. There is a moving story of Jesus lamenting that people have turned away from him. He sees the Israelites' pain and confusion and longs to gather them together as "a hen gathers chicks under her wings" (Mt 23:37).
